YOU CAN DONATE NATIVE PLANTS TO OUR GARDENS – DEADLINE IS MARCH 20

We invite you to donate native plants to our gardens through the Plant Dane Native Plant Program, a project of Dane County's Land and Water Resources Department. For a minimum donation of \$9, donors can purchase plants for Blair Street Gardens grown by a local grower. Plants are \$2.25 each and must be ordered in multiples of 4. To order, go to: https://rippleeffects.com/Order/Donate. Look for the Project field, then click on the down arrow and select Blair Street Gardens. Then select the number of plant sets you'd like to donate (each set is 4 plants). The plant varieties will be selected by BSG. The deadline to donate is March 20.

Plants will be used to refresh the gravel garden at The Gateway Garden, and the perennial bed at Wilson Green. Donations through this program would be greatly appreciated, and are an inexpensive way to maintain the gardens.

VOLLUNTEERS MAINTAIN THE GARDENS

During the 2019 gardening season, 5 volunteers contributed 38 hours during 7 Saturday mornings to maintain the gardens. Many additional hours were donated on an ad hoc basis.

GATEWAY GARDEN UPDATE Willy & E. Wilson Streets Reconstruction

This past summer, the City reconstructed Williamson and E. Wilson Streets on either side of the Gateway Garden. The City fenced off the gardens, so only minor damage was done which we will be repairing this spring. Unfortunately, the City will not be reimbursing BSG for the damage. The grade level area at the point of the Garden (west of the retaining wall) was paved and is now a staging area for pedestrians and bicyclists.

Reiner Family Tree

Once again, we will be replacing the evergreen tree that sits near the point of the Gateway Garden. A spruce was originally planted many vears ago by the Reiner family to commemorate the first Christmas tree in Madison, erected in 1855 in their family home which once stood near the garden. In 2016, we replaced that spruce tree because it was misshapen, too large for the site, and in the wrong place. But the replacement tree, also a spruce, became diseased, and was replaced in 2018. And now the third tree is dying, and will be replaced. Hopefully the 4th time will be the charm! Thank you to the Reiner Family for continuing to support the Gardens and for lighting the tree every holiday season.

Memorializing a Loved One

Opportunities to memorialize a loved one with a memorial tree or bench are available. The benches, designed by local artists Michael Burns and Kevin Earley, are made of white oak and aluminum. The design was inspired by shadows created by sunlight filtering through leaves. Memorial benches are offered at \$8,000 and memorial trees at \$1,000. MGE BED UPDATE

Our second garden nestles next to the MGE building on S. Blair Street. MGE has been generously donated the labor and plants for the garden for several years. In 2019 employees from MGE replanted the garden with pollinator - friendly plants. MGE worked with UW Extension to select native wildflowers that will help attract bees, butterflies and other beneficial insects. We appreciate MGE's continuing contribution.

WILSON GREEN UPDATE

BSG's third garden is called Wilson Green, and is located on E. Wilson Street across from World Nomad Pub (formerly The Cardinal Bar). It includes a large, raised perennial bed which we continued to maintain this past season. With the pathway and bench, it's a pleasant spot to relax.
