GATEWAY GARDEN UPDATE

The reconstruction of the "hairball intersection" at Willy Street and John Nolen Drive resulted in some damage to a retaining wall at The Gateway Garden which we repaired last fall.

The hornbeam tree that died the summer of 2023 did not die because of that summer's drought, as we originally thought. Turns out it was nibbled to death by rabbits who had dug a burrow nearby. Not sure if we'll replace it.

The conifer at "the point" of the gardens commemorates the first Christmas tree in Madison, erected in 1855 in the home of the Reiner family which once stood near the garden. The Reiner family lights the tree every holiday season. Thank you to the Reiner Family for continuing to support the Gardens.

WILSON GREEN UPDATE

We continue to maintain the large, raised perennial bed. Gary Tipler led a pruning workshop there this fall, demonstrating how to properly prune conifers to promote health and growth.

The city is planning to improve the lakeshore along John Nolen Drive, staring at the western end. Any improvements that might impact Wilson Green are not planned for at least 5 years or more.

LAKEFRONT PORCH IS OPEN

Congratulations to the volunteers who have created a marvelous gathering place on top of the Crowley (pumping) station next to Wilson Green. Now designated as a city park, it's a nice complement to Wilson Green.

VOLUNTEER TO MAINTAIN THE GARDENS
